Dessert First

Dessert must come first when you visit **Theo's Restaurant** in downtown Cambridge. Slices of lemon, chocolate, peanut butter, and cherry pie are topped so high with a tasty homemade meringue—you may not see the person across the table. There are more than a dozen different pies, so dig in!

Bake & Shake

The aroma of freshly baked glazed donuts, sugar cookies, pies and other goodies envelope you the

moment the door opens to **Kennedy's Bakery**. "The Original" as the locals affectionately call it, is located on Wheeling Avenue in downtown Cambridge, and has been part of the community since 1925.

Kennedy's Cakes and Donuts, located just a few miles from downtown, boasts 11 showcases of pastries—making it the largest display of baked goods in the state of Ohio. The shop has placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the U.S.A. Baking Contest. Did we mention they also have over 1 million milkshake flavors to choose from to wash down those sweets?

Family Style

Francis Family Restaurant allows everyone to gather and share the best of meals, conversation and time. Breakfast, lunch and dinner...Francis' offers scrumptious home-cooked meals. Pass the green beans, please!

Smokin'

The **Buffalo Bar & Grill** lives up to its name. The grill specializes in out-of-the-ordinary dishes, including its house special—bison burgers. You'll feel right at home here as you cozy up to a table and order from a full menu of breakfast, lunch and dinner platters.

A local icon, **The Point Restaurant** opened its doors in 1937 at the corner of Steubenville and Highland Avenues in downtown Cambridge. In the early days, The Point was like a mini-carnival with games, dart board competitions and stuffed animals for sale. Its tasty chicken, ribs and fish have always served as the main attraction for patrons. Today, the restaurant offers two-for-one steak night every Tuesday, features a bar to slide up to for a drink of ale and continues to be family owned and operated!



When You Have More Time...

The Forum – owned by the Theodosopoulos family, the restaurant's rich Greek heritage and famous dishes make you feel like you're one of the family. In addition to Greek dishes, favorite Italian, Mexican, and American creations are available.

Hall's Homemade Ice Cream – Located on Highland Ave. (St. Rt. 22), this family-owned 1950s shop is the perfect stop for delicious homemade ice cream! Open year-round, popular flavors are Butter Brickle, Maple Nut, and Orange Pineapple. Hall's also specializes in homemade desserts, such as Chocolate Covered Strawberries and Bon Bons!

Parkside Tasty Treat – Located near Cambridge City Park, this ice cream shop offers 24 flavors of Velvet hand-dipped flavors, including sugar free! What's the most popular item on the menu? Hand-dipped ice cream in a homemade waffle cone.

Courtside Deli & Mid-Town Bar & Grill – This quaint New York style neighborhood deli and bar specializes in hot New York style deli sandwiches and is located in a historic 1883 building next to the county courthouse.

Bear's Den – Located on the Old National Road (Route 40), this restaurant features elegant dining with a rustic appeal! The restaurant's popular rotisserie ribs, pastas, local farm-raised beef and seafood are divine. Outdoor seating is available.
