## **Cambridge Area to be featured on Fox Channel 8 – Cleveland *The Robin Swoboda Show***

"I was thrilled to learn that Robin was interested in traveling to the Cambridge area to film her show," stated Debbie Robinson, executive director of the Cambridge/Guernsey County Visitors & Convention Bureau. "The producer of the show, Rachel Stephens, called me late one afternoon asking for my assistance in contacting the area attractions Robin was interested in visiting. Robin had really done her homework by studying our website, VisitGuernseyCounty.com, and knew exactly what she wanted to feature on her show. I put the itinerary in place for her, contacted the attractions, and three days later Robin, Rachel and their cameraman Herb Thomas arrived for an overnight stay. The one-hour travel show will feature Salt Fork Lodge and State Park, the Stonehouse Museum, Mosser Glass Factory, the Byesville Scenic Railway, Dickens Victorian Village, the Hopalong Cassidy Museum, the National Museum of Cambridge Glass, the Living Word Outdoor Drama, and Georgetown Vineyards.
